## PART A

The Principal convened a meeting of the IQAC members at the beginning of the academic year 2011-12. In this meeting, steps were deliberated upon to improve upon the quality of the students and enrich the Institutional environment with feelings of healthy competitiveness and nationalistic pride.

Subsequently, a meeting with all the Faculty members was held by the Principal. Moreover, in view of the new Choice Based Credit System that the affiliating University had implemented this academic year, some discussions also had to be undertaken for its qualitative implementation. A few concrete steps for the same were decided upon.

- In absence of the State Government's permission for fresh appointments, it was decided to invite visiting lecturers in various departments to meet the ensuing demand.
- To offer a wide range of choice as Core and Elective subjects to students seeking admission to the First Year Bachelor of Arts Degree.
- To further enrich the College Library by adding to the list of subscribed magazines and books.
- To strengthen the Placement Cell of the college by reaching out to more and more companies and inviting them to conduct placement drives in the College for the students.
- To make the students of the College the beneficiaries of all the Programmes of the State Govt., the affiliating University and the UGC.
- To encourage the participation of Faculty and students in the various initiatives taken by the state govt. for quality enhancement of higher education in general.
- To encourage faculty participation in seminars, workshops and conferences.

- To further consolidate the NSS unit of the college, and involve the students in community services such as tree plantation drives, awareness regarding HIV/AIDS, girls' education and public awareness in rural areas.
- To encourage the CWDC to organize workshops/lectures for the girl students of the college.
- To invite experts from various fields and facilitate their interaction with students through lectures, talks, discussions, slide shows and such devices.
- To invite members of the Alumni Association and offer a platform to the current students to interact with them and enrich themselves in the process.
- To include all maximum cultural and academic activities in the academic year 2011-2012.

## **PART B**

1. In consequence of the meeting held at the beginning of the academic year, and in pursuance of the Institution's goals and objectives, a number of activities were conducted in the academic year 2011-2012. A brief summary of the same is hereby given:

1) During the academic year 2010-11, the NSS Wing of the college undertook several academic, social and creative activities. These were divided into (A) Projects (B) Camps.

(A) Projects undertaken by the NSS Wing :

(1) On 4<sup>th</sup> September, 2011, a blood donation camp was organised by the College in collaboration with the Indian Red Cross Society. Some 50 students from the College donated blood in this camp.

- (2) On 4<sup>th</sup> September, 2011, the NSS Wing organised a tree-plantation drive in the College Campus, in which all the Faculty members participated along with a large number of students.
- (3) On 20<sup>th</sup> September, 2011, nearly 150 students of the NSS Wing attended a lecture related to information about NAAC Accreditation, by a team from Pune.
- (4) On 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> September, 2011, students of the NSS Wing visited an old-age home, and even offered service to the aged residents of the home.
- (5) On 3<sup>rd</sup> October, 2011, students of NSS Wing visited the organisation 'Sugadh' dedicated to the protection of environment and thus obtained valuable information.
- (6) The NSS Wing celebrated the HIV/AIDS day on 1<sup>st</sup> December, 2011

(B) Camps undertaken by the NSS Wing:

- (1) In association with ManavSadhna, Gandhi Ashram, the NSS Wing organized a seven - day camp for generating public awareness in rural areas at Bhandoda village, District Banaskantha.
  - 2) At the Gujarat University Youth Festival held in September 2011, the college students won in six different events.
  - 3) The CWDC organised five street plays on various social issues as part of the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations.
2. The College functions within the academic guidelines laid down by Gujarat University. No new academic programmes have been initiated at the undergraduate level. However, as per the directives of the University, the College too implemented the Choice Based Credit System in the current academic year.
  3. As an affiliated College (Gujarat University), we do not have the prerogative of designing our own curricula; however, many of our senior faculty members are also members of Boards of Studies in various subjects.
  4. Since the College has to function along the guidelines laid down by Gujarat University, we have not implemented any inter-disciplinary programme as of now.
  5. With the implementation of the Choice Based Credit System from the current academic year, the College conducts internal evaluation in preparation for the semester exams as per University guidelines.

6. Though many of our students have taken the NET/SLET exams, as an Institution, we do not have the data about the number of them that have qualified in the same.
7. The College offers maximum encouragement to its faculty members to attend seminars, conferences, workshops on their concerned subjects. It further encourages those faculty members who undertake any research programmes/projects.
8. In the year 2011-12, the Department of Sanskrit organized a State level debate competition on the recitation of ShriBhagawad Gita. Two students from the College won a prize in the same.
9. No new research projects were undertaken in the current academic year. However, two faculty members from the English department have registered for their Ph.D., and are likely to obtain their doctorate degrees very soon.
10. We offer the Bachelors and Master's Degree in Humanities, hence we have not generated any patents so far.
11. No new collaborative research programme has been undertaken in the year 2011-12.
12. The College has not received any research grant in 2010-12.

25. The Administrative Section of the College has been fully computerized. Admissions, Examination results and Issuance of Certificates too have been duly computerized. The attendance records of all the students at the UG and PG level have been totally computerized.
26. In the academic year 2011-2012, infrastructural upgradation was not done. But the college has received funds from the UGC under two schemes, which will now be utilised for the infrastructural upgradation.
27. The software installed in the Computers of the Administrative Section and in the Computer Lab was upgraded. Windows 2007 was installed in each of these computers.
28. There has been no formal training programme for the faculty members regarding computer and internet access, as all faculty member of our college are fully familiar with computers. Direct internet access for the faculty members is now being provided under a new Central Government Initiative. The Students have a limited and monitored access to the internet.
29. Ours is a grant-in-aid College, fully funded by the State Government. Hence, as per the Government norms, scholarship is given to the girl students, and to the Students of SC, ST and OBC sections. Various privately funded scholarships are offered to students with outstanding achievements.
30. The Alumni Association organised a programme on Animals and their conservation practices. An avid environmentalist MukeshBhati presented a telefilm on Snakes and the need to protect them. To create awareness about Traffic rules, the Alumni Association organised a lecture by the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Ahmedabad City.
31. The 'Parents –Teachers' Association (PTA) is not a formally registered association within the college structure. However, parents are encouraged to give feedback as well as suggestions regarding teaching methodology or any other issue. In case of a student with low attendance, or continued absence, direct communication is sent to the parents/guardians regarding the same.
32. First-aid facilities are available in the College. An Annual Medical Check-up camp is held every year for students at UG level Blood donation camps and Health Awareness Workshops are organized at frequent intervals. Moreover, students and staff members have access to the University Health Centre.

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36. The Guidance and the Counselling Unit of the College is an active cell. In the academic year 2011-12, this Cell organized a series of Lectures by experts for training and orienting students for taking the GPSC and UPSC Exams.

Experts from various fields, including renowned speakers, officers who successfully cleared such competitive exams and senior beaurocrats were invited for delivering lectures on Personality Development, Skills to face the Interview Board, preparing for the exams and such other aspects.

The above Cell has also been guiding and counselling students about Student Exchange Programmes and how to apply in Foreign Universities.

37. The Placement Cell of the College makes all efforts to reach out to companies and encourage them to conduct campus interviews in the college premises. In the year 2011, a few prominent Companies offered attractive packages to our students as Customer Care Executive and content writer. HDFC offered an attractive package to one of our students as Sales Manager.

38. There are no development programmes for the non-teaching staff as of now.

40. As an undergraduate Arts College affiliated to Gujarat University, we have not formally developed any linkages with national/international academic/research bodies.

41. Our College has fulfilled all the obligations and commitments laid down in the Quality Assurance Report of the previous year.

## PART – C

The College has always striven to bring out the inherent potential of its students and faculty, and to instil qualities of patriotism and self-reliance among the students. In order that the students become responsible and sensitive citizens of society, there are a few concrete steps taken in the year 2010-2011.

1. With support of the Management, the College appointed Visiting Lectures in several departments in order to fill the lacuna created by retiring teachers.
2. The College Library was duly enriched by adding new books and magazines.
3. Internet access was made available to all the Faculty members in the new state-of-the art Computer Lab of the College.
4. The CWDC organised a Mock parliament to showcase the workings of the Parliament. It also organised a programme on creating awareness about girl education and empowerment. A street play was planned and performed by students of the NSS Wing under this programme.
5. The College has received a grant of Rs. 5, 60, 000 from the UGC under the General Development Assistance scheme. With the help of these funds, the Faculty room, the Accounts Office, the Administration Wing and the Principal's Office will be furnished and upgraded.
6. Under the Merged Scheme of the UGC, the College has received funds under two headings: 1) Improvement of Facilities – Rs. 179994; 2) Renovation of Infrastructure – Rs. 13, 48132. These funds will be utilised to renovate the Ladies' Room, and to renovate Room No. 35 with all new AV facilities in which conferences, seminars and workshops can be conducted.
7. The proposal of the College to the UGC for construction of new classrooms has been sanctioned, and an initial payment of Rs. 3,00,000 has already been received.
8. The College's proposal to hold two National Seminars has been sanctioned by the UGC.  
Under this, the college proposes to hold two seminars, the details of which are as under:
  - 1) Sanskrit department: National Seminar on "The Impact of Sanskrit on Great Indian Pioneers".
  - 2) History Department: National Seminar on "Importance of Study and Research in History – The Modern Perspective".
